Budget For 2025/26 Announced



The draft 2025-26 Budget was announced on 4th December with a record increase in frontline NHS spending, and plans to lift 15,000 children out of poverty by mitigating the UK Government's two-child benefit limit from 2026.

The 2025-26 Budget also includes a freeze in income tax rates, a record £15 billion for local government and £768 million to provide 8,000 more affordable homes, £4.9 billion of action to protect the environment whilst creating new jobs and opportunities, a real-terms uplift of 3% for spending on education and skills to maintain teacher levels and a £34 million uplift for culture in 2025-26

The Finance Secretary said "I am proud to present a budget that delivers on the priorities of the people of Scotland. Parliament can show that we understand the pressures people are

facing. We can choose to come together to bring hope to people, to renew our public services, and deliver a wealth of new opportunities in our economy.

"It is a budget filled with hope for Scotland's future and I look forward to working with all parties in Parliament to secure agreement around its provisions."

Gordon said "I'm delighted that the Scottish Government has developed a budget which includes measures which will tackle the acute impacts of poverty during a cost of living crisis whilst continuing to prioritise longer-term challenges such as the housing shortage and climate change.

"I also know many constituents will join me in welcoming the announcement that funding has been allocated to build a new Eye Pavilion in Edinburgh. This will undoubtedly benefit so many people throughout the city for years to come."

WASPI Women Denied Compensation



Gordon was shocked by the decision of the UK Government to decide against offering compensation to women hit by the changes to the state pension age.

The Women Against State Pension Inequality (WASPI) campaign group say 3.6 million women born in the 1950s were not properly informed of

the rise in state pension age. In March the Ombudsman recommended that compensation be paid out.

Representatives from the WASPI group attended the Scottish Parliament following the announcement and SNP MSPs offered continued support and solidarity with their campaign.

Gordon said "This is an utterly shameful decision by the UK Labour Government. Prior to the general election many Labour candidates, some of whom are now MPs, were wholeheartedly supporting compensation for the thousands of women affected by the changes. I along with my SNP colleagues will continue to support WASPI women in fighting for the compensation the Ombudsman recommended and which they rightly deserve."

Surgery Notice / Wester Hailes Library Update

Wester Hailes Post Office



Gordon was extremely concerned to hear of the proposed closure of the Post Office sited in the Westside Plaza Shopping Centre in Wester Hailes.

Gordon contacted Post Office Ltd urging them and the UK Government, who own the Post Office network, to reconsider this proposal based on the needs of the local community and other regular users of the service. He stated the service provided is invaluable not just to the local community but for those coming from other parts of the city visiting the shopping centre.

Post Office Ltd replied to advise that no decision has been made about the future of any branches. Gordon will continue to monitor the situation.

Radio Teleswitch Service Switch-off

The Radio Teleswitch Service (RTS) uses radio signals to tell some electricity meters to switch between peak and off-peak rates.



The radio signal will be shut down and the service it supports will end on 30 June 2025. Without an upgrade, the heating and hot water provisions in some homes or businesses that use RTS could be affected.

Gordon urges all those who they think have an RTS installation to contact their supplier to arrange a meter upgrade or to respond to their supplier when they are contacted regarding their RTS installation.

Gordon thanks the response team at Wester Hailes Police Station for inviting him to accompany them on their Friday backshift, especially the response officers he teamed up with.





